
Paper Pinwheel Ornament




Included in your kit are:

- 14, 1 1/4" squares
- * 14, 1" squares
- Small scalloped circle
- Small circle with image
- Large white circle
- Piece of ribbon
- Glue dots—large and small

You will need to supply:

- Scissors
- * Pen








Begin by cutting out the large white cardstock circle. Place one of the large glue dots near the edge of the circle and place one end of the ribbon on the glue dot, face up, as shown in Figure 2. Place a 2nd large dot over the 1st dot and loop the ribbon around, attaching the opposite end as shown in Figure 3.

Use a ruler to find the middle of the circle or simply fold the circle into quarters to find the middle. Make a mark at the center of the circle with your pen. Next, place 1 large glue dot over the mark at the center, as shown in Figure 4.



Begin with the 14 large squares. Fold the first corner slightly past the middle of the square as shown in Figure 5. Fold the opposing corner over top of the first, keeping the point at the bottom, as shown in Figure 6.





Place a small glue dot at the back (unfolded side) of 1 folded square. The edge of the square will hang over the circle in the next step so place the glue dot at about halfway. See the pen tip in Figure 7 for placement of the glue dot.



Place the first folded square on the large white circle, lining up the point with the center mark of the circle as shown in Figure 8. Continue placing glue dots on the backs of the large folded squares and placing them on the circle as shown in Figure 9, making sure to keep all the points lined up on the center dot of the circle and placing the side of a folded square snug against the previous placed square. Keep placing the squares until the circle is completely covered. Don't worry if you do not use all 14 of the folded squares.






Next, fold the 14 small squares as you did for the large squares. Use Figures 10 and 11 as a guide.






Place 1 large glue dot at the center of the ornament circle, overlapping the spot where all the points of the folded squares touch. The pen is pointing to the glue dot placement in Figure 12.



Place 1 small glue dot on the back (unfolded side) of one of the small folded squares. The pen is pointing to the placement of the glue dot in Figure 13.

Attach the first small folded square on top of a large folded square, making sure it is centered on the large square. Continue gluing and placing small squares, making sure to line up the points with the center of the ornament and lining up the side of the next square with the last until you have completed the circle of small folded squares as shown in Figure 14.







Use the 2 small circles to create an embellishment. Place a large glue dot on the back of the smaller circle with the clipart. Your clipart picture may differ from that in the Figure above. Center the clipart circle on the larger scalloped cardstock circle. Place 1 more large glue dot on the back of the scalloped circle and center this on the middle of the ornament as shown in Figure 17.



Your finished ornament is ready for hanging.

Don't have a kit or want to make more? You will need:

- Cardstock or heavy scrapbook paper. Cut 14 squares each that are 1" and 1 1/4" wide.
- * 8" piece of ribbon.
- 2" cardstock circle for backing.
- Punched paper decoration, sticker, button, etc. for the center embellishment.
- Scissors
- * Ruler
- * Pe
